

# **Autism Tip Sheet for Police**

#### What Does Autism Look Like?

- Sensory sensitivities (e.g., covering ears)
- Unusual eye contact
- Repetitive motor movements (e.g. rocking, hand flapping)
- Atypical speech or lack of speech
- Delayed responses

- Challenges with social interactions
- May not feel cold or pain in a typical manner
- Impaired sense of danger: may wander to water, traffic, etc.
- May not recognize First Responders as helpers

## Remember: Autism is a spectrum and each individual is unique.

#### **Sensory Sensitivities**

- Turn off sirens
- Speak quietly

## **Physical Guidance**

- Avoid touch if possible
- Move slowly

#### Communication

- One person talking at a time
- Calm tone
- Short, simple phrases
- · Give time to respond

## Searching

- May hide if frightened
- Collaborate with caregiver
- Search water first
- May not respond to name



#### **Visual Supports**

- Use pictures to explain
- Write step-by-step lists

#### First-Then

• Use "First-then" to create incentive. E.g. "First, go outside. Then play a game on my phone."
